

Pool Rental FAQ & Rules

- 1. Pricing: \$115/hr for a minimum of two hours
 - a. Includes certified lifeguards and Pool Manager
 - b. Usage of the pool is only between the designated pool rental hours
 - i. For example, if pool rental is from 11am-1pm, patrons may only use the pool facility between this specific time for set up, party, and take down
- 2. Your pool rental will be the only rental using the facility at your designated time.
- 3. If interested in renting a pool facility, contact Lauren Cronk at 392.2000 or LCronk@norrecreation.org
- 4. NOR must receive full payment and paperwork in order to secure the reservation (rentals are based on a first come, first serve basis).
- 5. Pool rentals are offered Saturdays and Sundays.
- 6. Anyone 8 years old and under must to be accompanied by an adult.
- 7. Proper swim attire is required for entering the pool.
 - a. No cotton clothing or jeans
- 8. Swim diapers are required for all diapered guests.
- 9. Only U.S. Coast Guard approved life jackets are allowed.
- 10. Diving allowed in designated areas only. Each patron must face the pool when jumping.
- 11. Food and beverages must be kept away from the pool area.
- 12. No glass bottles or alcohol permitted.
- 13. Secure personal items, NOR is not responsible for anything lost, stolen or damaged.
- 14. The following are **not allowed**:
 - a. Masks, fins, snorkels or non-approved flotation devices
 - b. Running on deck
 - c. Horseplay, sitting on shoulders, or throwing of patrons
 - d. Pets, drugs, alcohol, smoking, or glass containers
 - e. Items that could be dangerous to your safety and the safety of others
 - f. Oil-based tanning products
 - g. Open sore or cut
 - h. Abusive actions, language, or profanity
- 15. All pool toys must be approved by a Pool Manager prior to usage.
- 16. Any patron swimming in the deep end must complete a swim test prior to receive a wristband showing they are allowed to swim in the area.
- 17. Pool Capacity
 - a. Greenacres Pool- 125
- 18. Managers and lifeguards have full authority to enforce rules needed to ensure safety of staff and guests.
- 19. Whenever additional rules are deemed advisable for the health and safety of the swimmer, NOR may put additional into effect. Rules may be written or oral.
- 20. NOR reserves the right to refuse and/or revoke admittance as a safety precaution to protect all patrons and aquatic staff.
